

Margaret Anderson Kelliher's record on life

While serving in the Minnesota House, Margaret Anderson Kelliher had 99 opportunities to protect human life. **She voted against the pro-life position 99% of the time (98 anti-life votes).** Below are the issues in which she voted against the pro-life position.

Year	Issue
1999 House Floor Vote	Amendment to prevent family planning money from going to organizations that promote, provide or directly refer for abortions.
1999 House Floor Vote	Passage of HHS Omnibus Bill, which included numerous pro-life provisions like Woman's Right to Know, Parental Notification Data Bill and more
1999 House Floor Procedural Vote	Motion to send HHS Omnibus Bill back to Conference Committee where the pro-life provisions could be reinstated
1999 House Floor Vote	Adopt conference committee report of HHS Omnibus Bill, which no longer had the pro-life provisions it did headed into conference committee
1999 House Floor Vote	Final passage of HHS Omnibus Bill, which had all pro-life provisions stripped out of it
2000 Committee Vote	Amendment to add Woman's Right to Know to HHS Omnibus Bill
2000 House Floor Vote	Amendment to eliminate the authorization to construct a statue of former U.S. Supreme Court Justice and author of the infamous <i>Roe v. Wade</i> decision, Harry Blackmun
2000 House Floor Vote	Amendment to reaffirm and show support for the <i>Roe v. Wade</i> decision, which imposes abortion on demand in all 50 states
2000 House Floor Vote	Final passage of HHS Omnibus Bill, which included the Woman's Right to Know bill
2000 House Floor Vote	Amendment to replace language with the Woman's Right to Know language.
2000 House Floor Vote	Amendment to weaken Woman's Right to Know
2000 House Floor Vote	Final passage of Woman's Right to Know bill
2000 House Floor Procedural Vote	Amendment preventing organizations that promote, provide or refer for abortions from receiving funds through the State Employee Donations and Deductions Program (germaneness)
2000 House Floor Vote	Amendment attempting to prevent Crisis Pregnancy Centers from qualifying for the State Employee Donations and Deductions Program
2000 House Floor Vote	Amendment allowing affiliates of organizations that promote, provide or refer for abortions to qualify for the State Employee Donations and Deductions Program
2000 House Floor Vote	Amendment preventing organizations that promote, provide or refer for abortions from receiving funds through the State Employee Donations and Deductions Program
2000 House Floor Vote	Final passage of the State Employee Donations and Deductions Program, which had been amended to prevent public subsidies from going to organizations or affiliates of organizations that promote, provide or refer for abortion.

2000 House Floor Procedural Vote	Amendment to Anatomical Gift Education bill to prevent research on and transplanted tissue, cells, and organs procured from aborted babies (germaneness)
2000 House Floor Vote	Amendment to Anatomical Gift Education bill to prevent research on and transplanted tissue, cells, and organs procured from aborted babies
2000 House Floor Vote	Amendment to Runaway Youth Services bill, to prevent funds from going to organizations or affiliates of organizations that promote, provide or refer for abortion.
2001 House Floor Vote	Amendment to moved the state primary from September to June, which would make it increasingly more difficult for active grassroots involvement
2001 House Floor Vote	Amendment to the amendment, effectively eliminating all of the protective provisions that Woman's Right to Know would provide
2001 House Floor Vote	Amendment to HHS Omnibus Bill that would make Woman's Right to Know language in the bill exactly the same as the Senate language
2001 House Floor Vote	Amendment to allow organizations that promote or provide abortions to receive funding in the MCH block grant program.
2001 House Floor Vote	Amendment to ensure that abortion advocates would be allowed to receive funding through the Family Planning Special Projects grants.
2001 House Floor Vote	Amendment to cut funding for Governor's Teen Pregnancy Prevention program, where there were concerns about who would receive funding under this program
2001 House Floor Vote	Amendment to transfer money into Senior Service Corps from the Family Planning Special Projects grants, which gives hundreds of thousands of dollars to abortion-promoting organizations
2001 House Floor Vote	Final passage of HHS Omnibus Bill, containing Woman's Right to Know and numerous improvements in "family planning" money
2001 House Floor Vote	Motion to adjourn, used in attempt to prevent vote on amendment with the HHS Omnibus Bill language containing Woman's Right to Know
2001 House Floor Procedural Vote	Amendment with the HHS omnibus bill language containing Woman's Right to Know (germaneness)
2001 House Floor Vote	Final passage of HHS Omnibus Bill which included Woman's Right to Know
2002 Committee Vote	Amendment to delete Woman's Right to Know from the HHS Omnibus Bill
2002 House Floor Vote	Amendment to allow taxpayer dollars to go to abortion-promoting organizations.
2002 House Floor Vote	Amendment to remove Woman's Right to Know and the Taxpayer Protection Act from the HHS Omnibus Bill
2002 House Floor Vote	Final passage of HHS Omnibus Bill, which included Woman's Right to Know and the Taxpayer Protection Act
2003 Committee Vote	Passage of Woman's Right to Know out of committee
2003 House Floor Vote	Amendment to Woman's Right to Know requiring that women who have been a victim of sexual assault would not be given the information before an abortion
2003 House Floor Vote	Amendment to Woman's Right to Know requiring that women also be given information about family planning before undergoing an abortion. Abortion is not family planning nor should it be associated with family planning
2003 House Floor Vote	Amendment to Woman's Right to Know making it optional and allow for pro-abortion doctors and their associates to bypass the law
2003 House Floor Vote	Amendment to Woman's Right to Know not requiring women be informed about the link between abortion and breast cancer

2003 House Floor Vote	Amendment to Woman's Right to Know unnecessarily requiring federal fact sheet be given because bill already required scientifically medically accurate information must be provided

2005 Committee Vote	Passage of Positive Alternatives Act out of committee
2005 House Floor Vote	Final passage of HHS Omnibus Bill (included the Positive Alternatives Act, the Parental Notification Data Bill, Taxpayer Protection Act, and the Unborn Child Pain Prevention Act)
2005 House Floor Vote	Amendment to the Positive Alternatives Act, replacing Senate language with the House language
2005 House Floor Vote	Final passage of the Positive Alternatives Act

2006 Committee Vote	Passage of Abortion Regulation Act out of committee

2006 House Floor Vote	Abortion Regulation Act, motion to reconsider third reading

2006 House Floor Vote	Amendment containing the ban on taxpayer funded abortions provision of the Abortion Regulation Act
2006 House Floor Vote	Amendment containing the Parental Notification Data Reporting provision of the Abortion Regulation Act
2006 House Floor Vote	Final passage of bill amended to include ban on taxpayer funded abortions and Parental Notification Data Reporting provisions of the Abortion Regulation Act
2007 House Floor Vote	Amendment to ban taxpayer funding of abortions in Minnesota
2007 House Floor Vote	Amendment requiring abortionists to have admitting privileges at a nearby hospital to ensure proper care for women suffering from abortion complications.
2007 House Floor Vote	Amendment to restrict state family planning special projects grants from organizations that provide or directly refer for abortions.
2007 House Floor Vote	Amendment to restrict state family planning special projects grants from abortion-promoting organizations.
2008 House Floor Procedural Vote	Committee minority report for Kahn/Cohen Cloning Bill to encourage adult stem cell research and ban all forms of human cloning
2008 House Floor Vote	Amendment to Kahn/Cohen Cloning Bill encouraging stem cell research that doesn't involve creation or destruction of human embryos and authorized a study on creation of a state stem cell bank
2008 House Floor Vote	Amendment requiring Attorney General to render a legal opinion on the legality of ESCR in Minnesota
2008 House Floor Vote	Amendment to Kahn/Cohen Cloning Bill explicitly banning human cloning and ESCR while encouraging ethical forms of ASCR
2008 House Floor Vote	Final passage of Kahn/Cohen Cloning Bill
2008 House Floor Vote	Amendment to require an abortionist to offer a woman an opportunity to view an ultrasound of her unborn child prior to an abortion.
2008 House Floor Vote	Amendment to prohibit taxpayer funding of dangerous RU486 chemical abortions.
2008 House Floor Vote	Amendment to require dangerous RU486 chemical abortions to be administered only by a physician.
2008 House Floor Vote	Amendment to ban taxpayer funding of cruel saline abortions, which poison and burn unborn babies to death
2008 House Floor Vote	Amendment to ban taxpayer funding of sex-selection abortions, performed solely because of the gender of the unborn child.
2008 House Floor Vote	Amendment to ensure that a surrogate mother could not be forced to undergo an abortion.
2008 House Floor Vote	Amendment to prohibit abortion advocates from receiving grants from county and city governments.
2009 House Floor Vote	Amendment to amendment that would ban taxpayer funding of only reproductive cloning, but not also therapeutic/research cloning
2009 House Floor Vote	Amendment to amendment removing clarifying language which would make it much more difficult to maintain the provision banning tax-funded human cloning in conference committee
2009 House Floor Vote	Final vote on the amendment banning taxpayer funding of human cloning
2009 House Floor Vote	Amendment to ban taxpayer funding of abortions in Minnesota

2010 House Floor Vote	Amendment to ban taxpayer funding of abortions in the General Assistance Medical Care program
2010 House Floor Vote	Amendment to ban taxpayer funding of cruel saline abortions, which poison and burn unborn babies to death
2010 House Floor Vote	Amendment to gut proposal to cap tax-funded abortion reimbursements at \$300 per abortion
2010 House Floor Vote	Amendment that would prevent organizations that provide, promote or refer for abortions from receiving state family planning grants
2010 House Floor Vote	Amendment to exclude abortion coverage in the health insurance exchanges
2010 House Floor Vote	Amendment to license and regulate abortion facilities
